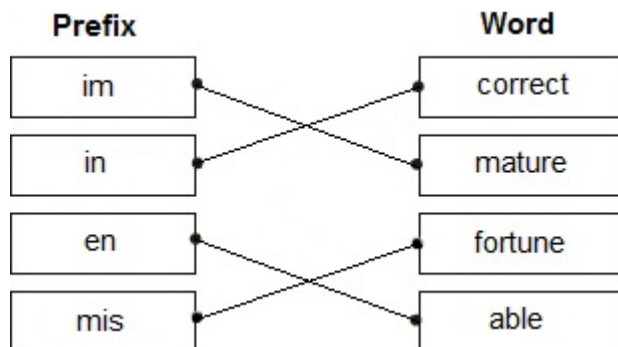
This means that the pasta *isn't fully cooked* .

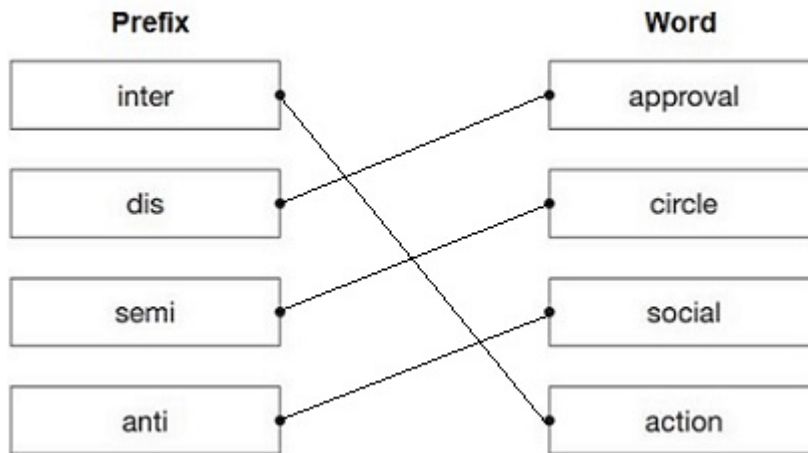

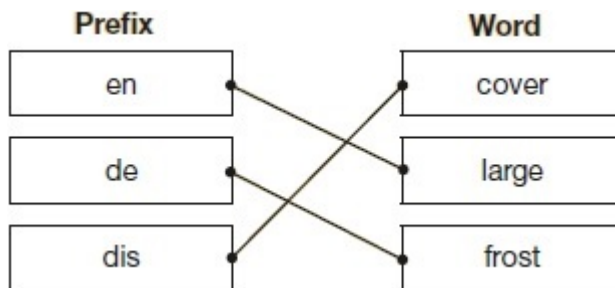
